Shell to sell up to 0.8 million tonnes per annum of LNG to Osaka Gas during the 25-year contract.

SINGAPORE – Shell Eastern Trading Pte Ltd (Shell) and Osaka Gas Co., Ltd. (Osaka Gas) have today signed a binding Sale and Purchase Agreement (SPA) for the long-term supply of liquefied natural gas (LNG).

The 25-year supply of up to 0.8 million tonnes per annum starting from April 2012 will be sourced from Shell's global LNG portfolio.

The agreement was signed in Singapore by David Wells, Vice President of Shell International LNG Supply and Kazuo Kakehashi, Senior Executive Officer, Osaka Gas.

"We are delighted to sign this agreement with Osaka Gas, one of our key customers and an important partner for Shell in the LNG industry. This signing represents another milestone in our growth of LNG supplies into Japan. Japan is a key market for Shell, and we are committed to help secure the energy the country needs, now and in the future," said David Wells.

Kazuo Kakehashi said, "I believe our broad relationship between Shell and Osaka Gas in the LNG business will remain crucially important in the days to come and hope that this long term contract will further strengthen our ties."
